CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE PIE

2 sticks butter-melted

1c white sugar

1T vanilla

1/4c cornstarch

2c M&Ms

1c brown sugar

1 lg egg and 2 egg yolks-room temp

2c flour

1/2t salt

3/4c peanut butter cups-chopped



Preheat oven to 350 and prepare a 9” pie plate with cooking spray. In a large bowl add the melted butter and the two sugars, beat well until combined. Beat the egg, egg yolks and vanilla. Add the flour, cornstarch and salt, mix until **just** combined, be sure not to over mix here!! Fold in both candies. Spread mixture in the pie plate. Top with more candy if desired. Bake for about 38 to 40 minutes, or until the top is golden brown, the edges are completely set and the center of the pie is just a bit jiggly. If your cookie begins to look too dark, you can place a piece of foil over the top until baking is complete. Cool about an hour before serving. You can top with some whipped topping for even richer dessert.



Guess what-it's roughly only about 48 days until spring (finally) gets here!

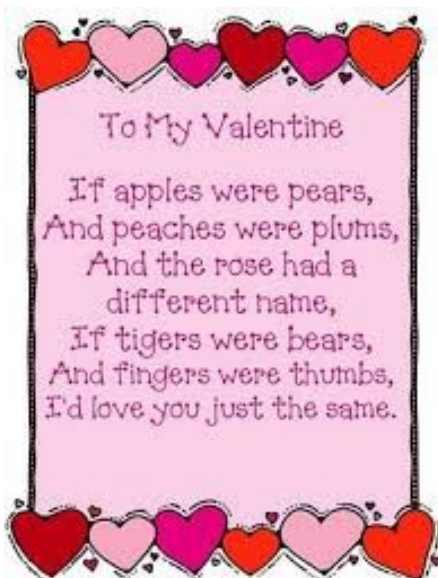

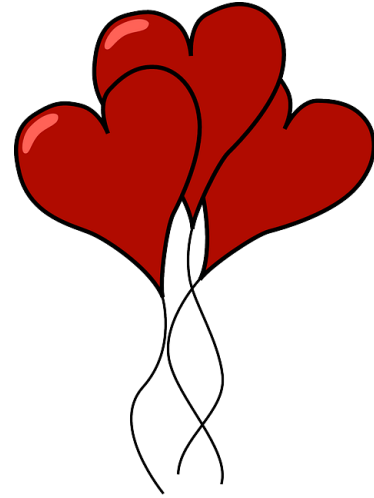
